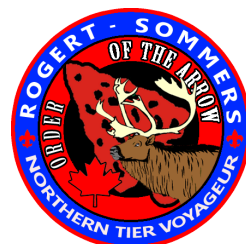

OA Wilderness Voyage

Since it began over a decade ago, this program has been changing lives while providing meaningful service to the beautiful Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness in Northern Minnesota's Superior National Forest.

The first half of the 12 day camping trip is spent doing conservation work for the US Forest Service to repair portage trails for the thousands of visitors the park hosts each summer. The second half of the trip is spent paddling the beautiful lakes, learning and practicing Leave No Trace ethics, observing wildlife, and building lasting friendships.

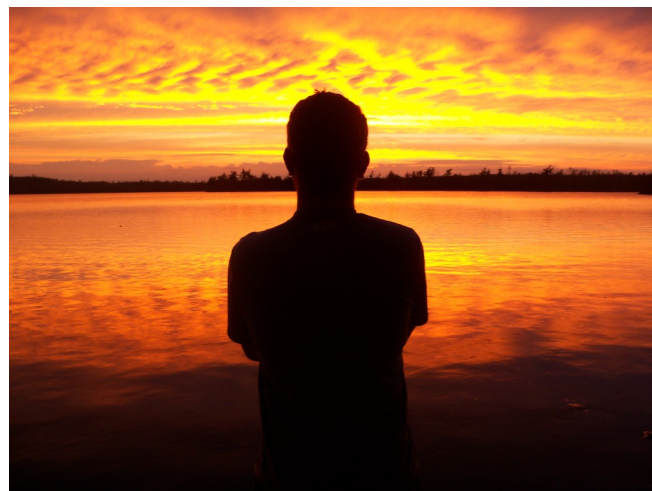

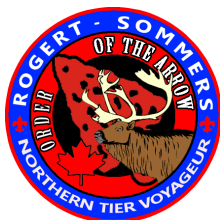
OA Canadian Odyssey
